LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

The Upper School Chamber Concert this week was once again a wonderful treat. GCSE and A Level students prepared, organised and delivered a concert of high quality and skill. So many students gave performances with their chosen instrument – piano, violin, drums, clarinet, trumpet, flute, classical guitar and voice and all of them thrilled a small, but special audience of friends and families. As the music teachers, Mrs Cooper and Mrs Rohweder, told me, this is the concert they most enjoy as they can sit back and be part of the audience and enjoy the music and appreciate what the students are able to do on their own. Well done to all the students involved. The musical talent and passion we have at Kendrick will be followed up in a few weeks' time with the staging of the musical *Into the Woods* which students and staff have been rehearsing for the last few months. There will be three performances of the show: Wednesday 20th, Thursday 21st and Friday 23rd November, tickets will be on sale next term. In December there will be the Christmas Concert and looking ahead to 2025, a group of Year 12 students have been to see me to confirm that we will once again hold the Air Ambulance Concert on March 12^{th,} a co-produced and organised concert with students from both Kendrick and Reading School. This concert is dedicated to raising money for the Thames Valley Air Ambulance service. Much to look forward to!

I had a meeting with the Kendrick Student Leaders yesterday who gave me a round-up of all the events and activities they have led and organised so far this term. Their enthusiasm is impressive and each committee – Curriculum and Current Affairs, Community, Wellbeing, plus the house Leaders - have each done so much to enhance the everyday life of students and the community spirit at Kendrick. From Debating club, accumulating food supplies for the Whitley Food Cupboard, acts of kindness and support for students who need a helping hand, and just being visible and introducing themselves to the younger students, they have done so well to demonstrate their positions in the school and role model what they do as student leaders to create such a positive school community. Thank you and well done to them. More widely, all our Year 13 students are working so hard on their A Levels at the moment whilst at the same time completing UCAS applications or nervously awaiting offers from applications they have made. This is such a tense and difficult time for them trying to balance so many expectations they have of themselves. For them in particular, the end of term break is eagerly awaited.

As we approach the end of Term 1, it is fair to say that the school has settled into a good rhythm of work, as well as plenty of other activities that students are involved in that develop their personal development. Staff and students seem familiar and used to the day to day, week to week demands and expectations of school life. This week assemblies were given to all students across the school on safeguarding and keeping safe. Mr Simmonds, Designated Safeguarding Lead and Mrs Hearn, Deputy Safeguarding Lead and I, outlined the structures we have in place to ensure the safeguarding, safety, security of our community. Mrs Hearn spoke to the students about times when we may feel a bit low and what we need to do if such feelings persist. She outlined the numerous trusted groups of adults in school that students can speak to, but also mentioned that parents are also the other important adults in children's lives. This time of the year can often be a time when some of those feelings come to the surface as people become more tired, overwhelmed by the work they have to do and the expectations they feel people have of them. The fact that this is the longest term in the school year makes such feelings completely understandable. The shorter days, colder weather marks the change of seasons which for some people can also cause anxiety and concern. The message to the students is always that they should try to talk to someone and that they will be listened to. As we approach half term, I would also like to ask parents to do some check-ins with their children, just to see that they are feeling comfortable with life at school and elsewhere. I am sure for many families this is a regular conversation they are having with their children. With the holiday break coming up at the end of next week talking and or planning some nice fun things to do with family and or friends might help brighten things up for everyone.

SELF-CARE: SPENDING TIME WITH SUPPORTIVE PEOPLE We all need people in our lives

we can turn to when we're struggling, whether for a deep discussion or just a chat. It can take the pressure off of needing to seem 'okay' just for a little bit because you know you can trust them. This could be a friend, family member, teacher or mentor- it doesn't matter as long as you feel safe and able to be real with them. Sometimes we just need a listening ear or a shoulder to cry on, other times advice can be really helpful.

Sometimes I get myself into such a tangled mess in my brain that I just need someone to talk it out with. I don't need an expert just someone to listen. There's a teacher at my school who is really good to go to.

If you're not sure who to go to that you trust or can't think of anyone in your life at the moment why not contact your local voluntary centre. They often have lots of knowledge around local charities and there are lots of organisations out there that exist specifically to provide young people with mentors and people they can talk to.

In this video, Dr. Roslyn Law gives some advice about how being around supportive friends and family or other trusted individuals can help you if you're feeling low or anxious or struggling with poor mental health.

YEAR 13 INTERVIEW CONFIDENCE WORKSHOP - THURSDAY 7TH NOVEMBER

As part of Kendrick School's commitment to delivering high-quality Careers Education Information, Advice and Guidance, we are delivering an 'Interview Confidence Workshop' to all our Year 13s.

Date: Thursday 7th November: Periods 1-3 (morning)

There is no cost to you for this event.

The day has been planned for students to hear from two industry sectors who will provide up to date information on Assessment Centre Interviews and Professional Interview techniques. The third session will be an interactive small-group interview-practice session, supported by around 26 under-graduate, graduate and apprenticeship student-leaders. The student leaders' courses will be closely matched to the aspirations of our current cohort of students.

This event is applicable to all our students, whether they are:

- Applying for a degree course that requires an interview.
- Applying for an apprenticeship.
- Applying for a vacation-internship.
- Applying for a competitive work-placement for a university 'Sandwich Course' (Year Out in Industry).
- · Paid and/or voluntary work (professional or casual).

This is a compulsory event for all year 13 students.

KENDRICK SIXTH FORM - OPEN EVENT

YEAR 11 PARENTS/CARERS AND STUDENTS

We would like to remind you about some significant events for Year 11. Our annual **Post 16 Conference** will take place on **Tuesday 12th November**. This event will take place throughout the day, students will receive information about post-16 choices and expectations of the universities and industry. Students will also hear about the subjects available at Kendrick School and life in Kendrick's Sixth Form.

The **Sixth Form Open Evening** will take place on Thursday 14th November and will allow students and parents a chance to speak with departments about their potential A-level choices. The event will take place between **4pm and 5.30pm** and this session will be for Kendrick students and their parents only. The subject areas will be open between 4pm and 5pm and there will be a talk in the Hall at 5pm from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher, Mrs Hearn, Assistant Head and Head of Sixth Form and some current Kendrick Sixth Form students. **Tickets are not needed for this event**. Students should meet with their parents outside of school and re-enter and register for the event via the East Street entrance. The subject areas will close promptly at 5pm in order for the talk to start on time, so please allow plenty of time to visit all the subjects your child is interested in. Each student can have up to two adults with them, however, unless there are exceptional circumstances (for example, a single parent), for health and safety and capacity reasons, we ask that younger siblings do not attend this event.

Y11 Parents' Consultation will be held online on **Thursday 5th December**. The timings of all of these events have been deliberately organised so that we can support both the students and parents/carers in the decisions to be made about options post-16. In **December 2024**, the students will be asked to indicate subject preferences and from these, option lines will be drawn up and presented to the students at the end of **January 2025**. Students will be expected to confirm whether they will stay on at Kendrick to attend the Sixth Form in **March 2025**.
