ONLINE GROOMING CRIMES AGAINST CHILDREN INCREASE BY 89% IN SIX

YEARS Source NSPCC

As offences rise to record levels, NSPCC is calling for a strengthened approach from Ofcom and for tougher legislation from the UK government.

- More than 7,000 Sexual Communication with a Child offences were recorded by police last year (2023/24) –
 up 89% since 2017/18 when the offence first came into force.
- Almost half of offences were on Snapchat (48%), where a means of communication was known.
- Most grooming cases (81%) take place against girls while primary school children are also being targeted by
 offenders.
- NSPCC is urging Ofcom to significantly strengthen its approach to child sexual abuse and for the UK
 government to ensure the regulator can tackle grooming in private messaging.

Online grooming crimes have reached record levels across the UK, with offences topping 7,000 for the first time, new data compiled reveals.

The figures, provided by 45 UK police forces, show 7,062 Sexual Communication with a Child offences were recorded in 2023/24 - up 89% since 2017/18 when the offence first came into force.²

The data in detail

The data reveals the most common platforms that perpetrators used to target children online, in cases where the means of communication was disclosed.

- 1. Snapchat 48%
- 2. WhatsApp (Meta) 12%
- 3. Facebook and Messenger (Meta) 10%
- 4. Instagram (Meta) 6%
- 5. Kik 5%.

Perpetrators typically used mainstream and open web platforms as the first point of contact with children.

This can include social media chat apps, video games and messaging apps on consoles, dating sites and chatrooms. Perpetrators then encourage children to continue communication on private and encrypted messaging platforms where abuse can proceed undetected.

Of total cases where gender was known in 2023/24, 81% of children targeted were girls.

The youngest victim of online grooming in 2023/24 was a 5-year-old boy.

Thomas* was 14 when he was groomed online. He said:

"Our first conversation was quite simple. I was just chatting. The only way I can describe it is like having the most supportive person that you could ever meet.

"After about a month, the pressure started to build of him trying to prove that I was gay. That's when he started sending explicit pictures and pressuring me to send images to him. I did send him pictures, but I didn't like it and I didn't want to do it anymore.

"He said he had saved the images and would send them to everyone if I stopped sending more pictures. There was a constant fear in the back of my mind. It wasn't easy but I managed to block him on all sites and carry on with my life."

PARENTS' ULTIMATE GUIDE TO SNAPCHAT Source: common sense media

What is Snapchat?

Snapchat is a popular messaging app that lets users exchange pictures and videos, called snaps, that are meant to disappear after they're viewed. The essential function is to take a picture or video, add filters, lenses, or other effects, and share it with friends. The app is free to download, and also has a premium subscription plan called Snapchat+. (Note: If you're looking for more parental insights on your kids' favourite things online, sign up for our <u>family movie night newsletter</u>.)

How does Snapchat work?

All you need to sign up is your name, an email address or a phone number, and your birth date. To add friends, you can upload your contacts or search for people you know. You can also automatically add someone by taking a picture of their "Snapcode," a special QR code unique to each user.

After that, things get a little confusing. On Snapchat, you usually start the communication by sending a photo or video, not a text message. To begin a conversation, you tap the big camera circle and take a snap. There are all sorts of photo-editing tools, as well as filters to decorate your images and videos. Once you customize your "snap," you can send it to anyone on your friends list, add it to your story (which is a record of the day that your friends can view

for 24 hours), and add it to Snap Map (which displays your photo on a map of your location that can be viewed by anyone on Snapchat).

Snapchat provides several options for sharing and managing snaps. In addition to individual messaging, Snapchat offers group chats that everyone in a group can contribute to. You can delete the text messages you send, though in a group chat the other people will see that you've deleted something.

How old do you have to be to use Snapchat?

According to the <u>terms of service</u>, users must be 13. You have to enter your birth date to set up an account, but there's no age verification, so it's easy for kids under 13 to sign up. Common Sense Media rates Snapchat OK for <u>teens 16 and up</u>, mainly because of the exposure to age-inappropriate content and the marketing ploys, such as quizzes, that collect data.

KENDRICK SIXTH FORM - OPEN EVENT

YEAR 11 PARENTS/CARERS AND STUDENTS

We would like to remind you about some significant events for Year 11. Our annual **Post 16 Conference** will take place on **Tuesday 12**th **November.** This event will take place throughout the day, students will receive information about post-16 choices and expectations of the universities and industry. Students will also hear about the subjects available at Kendrick School and life in Kendrick's Sixth Form.

The **Sixth Form Open Evening** will take place on Thursday 14th November and will allow students and parents a chance to speak with departments about their potential A-level choices. The event will take place between **4pm and 5.30pm** and this session will be for Kendrick students and their parents only. The subject areas will be open between 4pm and 5pm and there will be a talk in the Hall at 5pm from Ms Kattirtzi, Headteacher, Mrs Hearn, Assistant Head and Head of Sixth Form and some current Kendrick Sixth Form students. **Tickets are not needed for this event**. Students should meet with their parents outside of school and re-enter and register for the event via the East Street entrance. The subject areas will close promptly at 5pm in order for the talk to start on time, so please allow plenty of time to visit all the subjects your child is interested in. Each student can have up to two adults with them, however, unless there are exceptional circumstances (for example, a single parent), for health and safety and capacity reasons, we ask that younger siblings do not attend this event.

Y11 Parents' Consultation will be held online on **Thursday 5th December**. The timings of all of these events have been deliberately organised so that we can support both the students and parents/carers in the decisions to be made about options post-16. In **December 2024**, the students will be asked to indicate subject preferences and from these, option lines will be drawn up and presented to the students at the end of **January 2025**. Students will be expected to confirm whether they will stay on at Kendrick to attend the Sixth Form in **March 2025**.
