LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

At last, we have come to the end of term, and I know that everyone in the school community is ready for a break. Finishing this close to Christmas means we have more days after the festive period returning to school on the 6th January for staff, and 7th January for students.

As always, we finished the term altogether in an assembly at the end of the day when we reflected on the term and the work and activities that students and staff have been part of. We listened to some music, including a fun piece from our Year 7 Choir who sang an upbeat song called *Under the Tree*. We also listened to the winning poem from National Poetry Competition, written by Faith on the theme of *Counting* and poems from the Winter Poetry competition featured above. We heard reports from several groups of students representing different areas of the school: the Kendrick Student Leaders with their round up of events, Sudiksha and her appointment as Cadet to the Lord Lieutenant, as well as reports from leaders of the Inspire Club and Refugee Club. We considered the themes of the Christmas Assembly prepared by Mr Hodge and watched by all students this week which is <u>here</u>. Finally, I concluded the assembly with some moments of reflection considering this time of year and how it can be a time of fun, presents and parties for some, but it can also be a time of great sadness and loneliness for many people who may be on their own or without a loved one at this time. In the Christmas Assembly Mr Hodge asked us to think about the message of the Christmas story, of peace, love and joy. By focusing on the shepherds in the story, Mr Hodge asked us all to see and treat everyone with respect and kindness, regardless of their status or position in life because everyone is precious and has worth.

Finally, as I have in recent weeks, I will finish with another poem from our Poetry Advent Calendar, prepared by Mr Dilley. Again, using Mr Dilley's words:

'For O'Donohue, being "slow" is not just about resting and relaxing, but also about an inner state of mind which involves holding on to our integrity, hope and faith in the future. At the same time, the poem reminds us that this is not always easy, but in a way that seems reassuring rather than discouraging - ...the instruction in the second verse is qualified with "as best you can", and also the description of "your hesitant light". I hope you enjoy the tentative optimism for those "fresh pastures of promise" that this poem offers.

It is rather fitting that the final of word of this poem - and this sequence of poems - is "beginning", reminding us that every ending is also the beginning of something new.'
