LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

I have just come back from a fun event in the Hall where I found myself colouring! As part of Children's Mental Health Week, our Wellbeing Ambassadors and staff organised some activities around the theme Know Yourself, Grow Yourself. Tables were set out with activities highlighting the different emotions that can affect how we feel at any time in the day: anger, joy, sadness, disgust fear, anxiety, envy and embarrassment. These emotions are based on the film Inside Out 2, which was the popular choice for Film Night for Year 7 earlier in the year. On other days of the week, we had Emotional Bingo Wednesday and chalk drawings on Thursday, all of which have been organised to engage and provide students with some relaxation and therapeutic wellbeing activities during their lunch break. I really enjoyed my 10 mins of colouring with Zaynab and Aadya putting me in a relaxed frame of mind to write the Weekly Update!

At the KPS hosted drop-in for Year 8 and 9 parents last night, we had some useful conversations about student life in school. Accompanied by Miss Hyde, Head of Key Stage 3, we responded to several very sensible questions from parents. It was useful to be able to give some clarity on processes and procedures which enables parents to understand why we do what we do. Questions around trips came up and as always, I presented the school position on trips which is that all trips in term time are linked to curriculum related themes, including residentials. We do not offer a vast array of residential trips for several reasons: cost and time out of school and the burden on staff. Some schools offer more trips, some fewer. I feel at Kendrick we have a good balance that supports our staff and students. The issue of parent consultations was also mentioned and the question about whether we will revert to face to face meetings. This will not happen for some very basic reasons related to the efficiency and effectiveness of the online meetings, environmental factors and teacher workload. Parents of students currently in Years 7-11 have not had face to face consultations as the online meetings started in March 2020 at the start of the lockdown period. As in most work places, the issue of making work more flexible emerged and in some situations has proved to be a better way of doing things. When we explained the reasons in more detail, parents were most understanding. As Year 9 parents were present, the topic of GCSE options came up and the options process for Year 9 begins after half term. I am grateful to the 40 parents who engaged in the evening and to KPS for organising the event. The next drop in is for parents of Year 10 and 11 students on Tuesday 4th March at 5.30-6.30pm. I will be joined at that meeting with Mme Hulley Head of Key Stage 4.

At the end of last week four of our students Sophia, Elizabeth, Swathi and Anya went to Reading School as part of 'The Great Debate Competition'. Having got through the first round of this competition organised by the Historical Association and Mr Curran, Head of History, they each addressed the question *how can your local history tell a global story?* Each student looked at different theme related to Reading's history and delivered a most engaging and intelligent speech on their chosen topic. The winner of the local round, which included students from other schools was Anya, who now goes through to the national heat. Well done to Anya and to the other students who got to the local final and the many others who applied for the competition.

A couple of reminders: firstly, House Drama next week on Thursday 13th February. The theme of *Out of Time* will be represented by all three Houses, and I expect some interesting and intriguing interpretations on this theme. Doors will open at 6.10pm for a 6.30pm start, tickets are £3 and can be bought here. Also, a reminder from last week about the careers event we are holding in March, Design Your Future, here is the <u>poster</u> with details of the event.

SAFER INTERNET DAY - 11TH FEBRUARY 2025 SOURCE UK SAFER INTERNET CENTRE

This Safer Internet Day is about starting conversations about how to spot, respond to and report all types of scams online. Scams can take many forms and may target anyone, including young people. Use these top tips to keep you and your family safe online.

Enjoy going online together and talk regularly about your family's online lives The internet is amazing and can help us all to access information and entertainment. Spend time online with your child to understand how they are using technology and talk together about the good and the bad parts of being online. Talk about your own experiences and find other opportunities to get the conversation started, like stories in the news. Make sure your child knows they can talk to you about anything that they see or experience online.

Take online security measures seriously The internet can be a tool used by criminals to target their victims, but a few <u>simple steps</u> can help keep you and your accounts secure. Use <u>strong and separate passwords</u> for online

accounts and <u>set up two step verification</u> (2SV) where it's available. You may also be able to <u>set parental controls</u> to prevent unwanted online purchases and limit children's access to harmful content.

Look out for warning signs that someone or something online cannot be trusted "It just seems too good to be true!" – Other common signs of a scam include contact that you weren't expecting or being asked for money or personal information (think: bank or contact details, passwords, or phone numbers). Scammers use <u>other tactics</u> to manipulate their victims into paying, like playing with your emotions, or building a sense of urgency so you are rushed into making a decision. If you aren't sure it's reliable, don't risk it.

Remember that anyone can be a victim of a scam Scammers are good at what they do and will target anyone. We all need to stay vigilant and support those who are most vulnerable including children and the elderly by helping them recognise what to look out for. If anyone in your family has been scammed, talk openly about it. There should be no shame in being victim to a scam and it's never your fault.

Know where to get help if something goes wrong If you or someone you know has been the victim of a scam online, you're not on your own. Help is available and you are not to blame for what has happened. In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you can report fraud and cyber crime online to <u>Action Fraud</u> or by telephoning 0300 123 2040. In Scotland, report to Police Scotland by calling 101.

You may also be able to report via social media, if the scam has taken place there or to another relevant organisation, like your bank, if you think your account is at risk.

Remember, if you or anyone else is in immediate danger, call 999 immediately.

CHILDREN'S MENTAL HEALTH WEEK SOURCE NSPCC



This week has been **Children's Mental Health Week**. The theme this year is '**Know Yourself, Grow Yourself'** to encourage children, young people and adults to embrace self-awareness and explore what it means to them. Place to Be partnered with Disney Inside Out 2 to help children and young people to discover how getting to know who they are can help them build resilience, grow and develop.

At school our students took part in chalk drawing to express their emotions creatively, emotional bingo to match feelings with fun in tutor time and on Friday we held a fun event in our hall with stalls of fun games, compliment boards, and challenges, each themed around a different emotion.

Parents and carers are key to supporting young people in their lives and helping build resilience and recognise their emotions. Five top tips from <u>Place to Be</u> for families are as follows:

Encourage journalling Just like Riley, encourage your older children and young people to express their emotions and thoughts through journalling. It can be less confronting than speaking out loud and is a helpful way to process what is going on.

Make space for reflection When children and young people reflect on their different emotions, it can help them better understand themselves and what they need. Go for a walk, drive, or try some mindful colouring or baking together

Be visual Use imagery, such as emojis or flashcards to help children and young people recognise and label their feelings.

Practice mindfulness Try mindful activities, and quiet family time, to enjoy being in the present moment. This can help children and young people be aware of their thoughts and emotions and learn a useful new coping technique.

Communicate Feedback is crucial for helping us see our blind spots and gain greater insight. Children and young people are no different. Creating safe and supportive ways to share your own experience with your child can help them understand themselves and their impact on the world around them.
