LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Welcome back to school! I hope everyone has had a restful and peaceful holiday and I wish you all a very happy New Year. We welcome one new member of staff to Kendrick this term, Mr Gulliford, who joins our caretaking team.

Staff had an INSET Day on Monday 7th January undertaking further professional training on important aspects of education. We looked at online safety for students, a regular theme in our training, plus elements of Learning and Teaching practice and SEND provision. In addition, I introduced an important initiative on Racial Literacy. This is a programme of training that all staff, students and trustees will receive over the next few months, which I will speak more about in due course.

School life has resumed quickly, and it was wonderful to welcome students back after the break. Students were straight back into lessons period 1 on Tuesday with Year 11 students very quickly settling to their mock examinations, which will be finish on Friday 17th January. Mock examinations are always an intense and stressful period, but they serve the purpose of identifying knowledge and understanding for students so that teachers can respond to their needs and support further learning and revision for the final exams in the summer.

Back to last term, on 17th December we had a most pleasant event when we welcomed back our former Year 13 students and their parents for the presentation of A Level certificates. This cohort of students joined Kendrick in September 2017 at the time of the school's 140th birthday celebrations. They studied their GCSE courses during the pandemic and were the first cohort of students who did sit GCSEs in the summer of 2022 following two years of no written exams. Throughout their time with us they were a most enthusiastic, hardworking, and lively group of students who focused well on their studies and contributed enormously to school life. Their results at A Level were excellent and the university destinations and courses they are now studying are impressive. We are so very proud of them and wish them all the best for the future. As part of the presentation ceremony, a former student gives a speech. This year the speaker and presenter of the certificates was Isabel Irvine, who left Kendrick in 2017. Isabel pursued her passion for singing after she left Kendrick. She went on to study Music, Opera, at the Royal Academy of Music in London. She completed a degree and masters qualification and is now an Opera Singer. In her speech, Isabel spoke about how she has had to manage rejection and imposter syndrome in the world of the performing arts because of the immense competition in this profession. However, with passion and persistence she said that she is determined to do all she can to work and perform as an opera singer and develop her career in this filed. At the end of the ceremony, Isabel delighted us by singing an aria called *Venite Inginocchiatevi* from *Le Nozze di Figaro*. Isabel's uniqueness in both the profession she has chosen to pursue and the voice and determination she has inspired us all.

To end I would like to share Isabel's concluding remarks to the students at the presentation event:

As you step into this next chapter of your lives, remember this:

1. Rejection is not a reflection of your worth.

- 2. Imposter syndrome is just a sign that you're stretching beyond your comfort zone—and that's where growth happens.
- 3. Your journey will not look like anyone else's, and that's the beauty of it. Celebrate your individuality and trust the process.

The world needs your ideas, your courage, and your voices even if you don't think it does. Embrace the challenges, because they will shape you into the person you're meant to become.


