Kendrick School - Weekly Update Friday 7th June 2024

LETTER FROM MS KATTIRTZI, HEADTEACHER

Welcome back and I hope everyone has had a good half term break.

Term 6 is always a very busy term and this year there seem to be even more trips and activities. Starting from the last weekend, students and staff were on another Duke of Edinburgh expedition which requires a practice weekend, as well as a final expedition for the award to be fulfilled. Mr Crowther and a group of colleagues have taken several students on the practice experiences at both Bronze and Silver Award level. The final test of their energy, resilience and endurance will take place later in the term. Shortly our Modern Foreign Language staff and colleagues will be taking Year 10 students on a week-long trip to France and Germany to practise and immerse themselves in the language and culture of these two countries. All students at Key Stage 4 study a Modern Foreign Language so this trip is of great importance in their studies, although I also know that the prospect of being away from home and with friends is also very exciting and fun for the students. I am sure they will have a great time. Later in the term, Year 8 students are being offered a taster session to consider joining Reading School and Kendrick School Combined Cadet Force (CCF) when they are in Year 9. Led by Mrs White and colleagues at Reading School, I know that many students get a great deal out of this organisation in terms of skills and leadership. There are other trips and activities planned throughout the term and I am grateful to the willingness and commitment of Kendrick staff who volunteer to take these trips, which require their own time, sometimes away from home and their families, taking care and responsibility for the students. I am sure students and parents also appreciate and acknowledge these experiences their children can have at Kendrick School.

We are about halfway through the public exam season and some students have taken many papers, others have quite a few to go. As I have said before, this period of exams for our young people can be very stressful and tiring. My thanks to the students for their resilience and strength in the way they have conducted themselves so far, planning, preparing, and managing this period. And of course, all the staff including the Exams Team, invigilators, teachers, and staff who make sure that everyone is where they need to be every morning and afternoon, showing care and sensitivity to the students. I am sure the same support and encouragement is happening at home, so thank you to parents too. Internal exams for Year 10 finished before half term and today a week of Year 12 exams finish. Well done to those students for their work and efforts at this stage in their courses.

I am sure people know that running a school is very much like running a business. We must determine curriculum, assessments, staffing and budgets and this is the time of the year when our planning is focused on the new academic year ahead. In school I lead the strategic vison of the school and work with my leadership team and colleagues on the operational side, taking my responsibilities and accountabilities from the Department for Education's, Headteacher Standards. In this work, our school, like all others, has a Board of Trustees, a group of about 16 individuals that work with me and my Senior Leadership Team to oversee what the school sets out to do. The Trustee Board is made up of committed individuals from the local community, staff and parents who meet regularly to discuss, question, and confirm actions and decisions the school would like to take. From time-to-time vacancies on the Board become available and earlier in the week we asked for nominations for two Parent Trustee positions. Four parents have applied, and all parents have been asked to vote for the candidates. If you have not voted yet, please find the email sent to you today to do so. I look forward to working with the successful candidates in the future.

Meanwhile in school, Pride Month is under way and two super displays have been put up in the library and in the Horizons dining area. Many activities are being planned over the next few weeks to mark Pride month. Thank you to the staff and students working on this initiative. Elsewhere the Eco Group is planning activities for this term. I have received several emails from Mrs Kaur this week about the work of our Eco group, including the work of our Energy

Ambassadors who have been involved in a 'cut your carbon initiative' at the end of last year which has resulted in everyone endeavouring to be more fuel efficient in school, switching off lights, screens, recycling etc. This term there is a focus on wildlife and nature in gardens which I am sure we will hear more about in due course.

Following the announcement the government made before half term to call an election in July, Kendrick, as part of its citizenship responsibilities, will have its own Mock or Parallel Election as we have done in previous national elections. Mrs Lace and Mr Duncan, our PSHCE Coordinators will be working with the Curriculum and Current Affairs Committee of the Kendrick Student Leaders to organise the elections. We will have candidates from the main parties who will represent the policies of a party as articulated in the individual party's manifesto. We eagerly await the manifestos to be published so that we can get started! Our election will take place around the time of the General Election, and we will see how it compares. Several of our students are interested in politics and there will be many students in Year 13 who will be eligible to vote for the first time this year. I hope everyone takes an interest in the debates and for the Year 13 voters, I hope they exercise their right to vote, given the hard fought battles women went through to achieve the vote around 100 years ago – 1918 when women over the age of 30 who were householders received the vote and 1928 when all women were given the vote on the same terms as men.

To finish I would like to acknowledge the ceremonies and events that have been taking place this week to mark the 80th anniversary of the D Day Landings. There are many sources of information available, but this <u>link</u> from the BBC of the last couple of days gives us a glimpse in photographs of the commemorations of this significant event in history.
